Carers SA supports people who care for a family member or friend who is ill, living with disability, frail, or living with mental health challenges. We support Carers to stay strong, healthy, and connected.

About the Role

This role is about helping Aboriginal Carers feel supported, heard, and connected, so they can keep caring for others while staying strong themselves. You will get to know Carers through a yarn, in person, by phone, or in community, and walk alongside them to find the right supports.

What You Will Do

- **Connect Carers with supports**
Get to know each Carer's situation and link them with the right support at the right time.
- **Coach and encourage**
Support Carers to set goals, build on their strengths, and make confident decisions.
- **Bring Carers together**
Facilitate yarnning groups and Carer support groups: culturally safe, welcoming spaces to share stories.
- **Work in community**
Attend community events and gatherings, and build relationships with Aboriginal organisations and Elders.
- **Team up**
Work closely with the Aboriginal Community Engagement Officer and the wider Carers SA Aboriginal Community Team.

You build connections with Carers, families, Elders, and community, and understand culturally safe support.



Confident with computers and phones
You can keep track of information using everyday systems, with training and support provided.

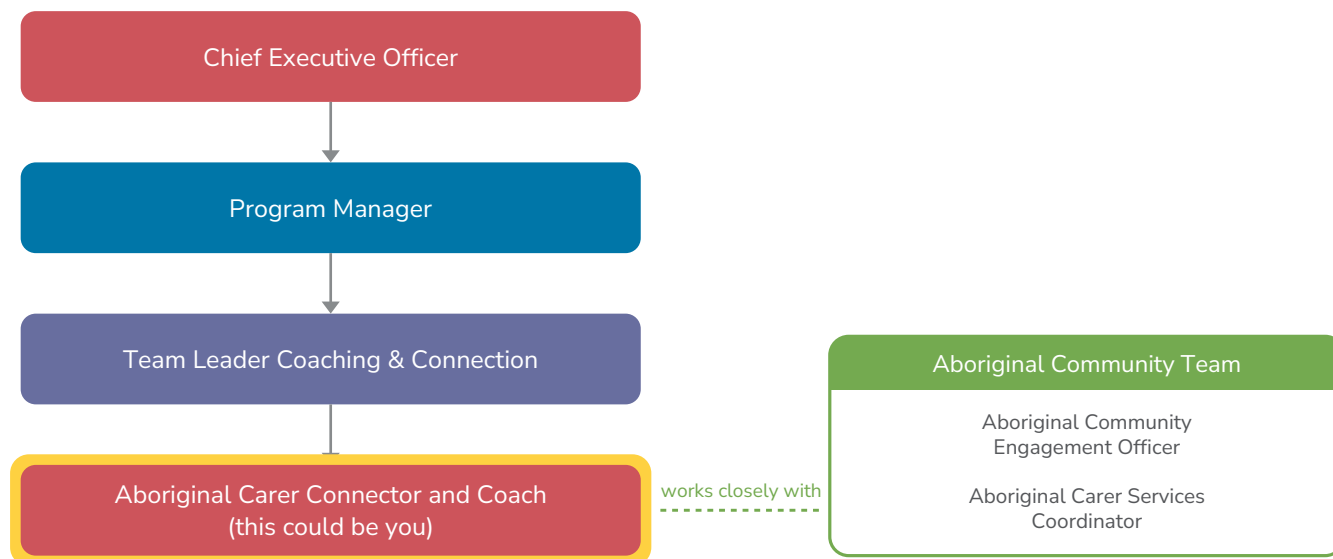


A driver's licence and willing to travel
